We hope your new year is starting off well! We know many pecan growers across Texas were happy to see 2022 and the difficult conditions the year brought in the rearview mirror. We hope this year meets you with great success during the growing and harvest season. The Texas Pecan Growers Association (TPGA) staff and Board of Directors will continue to work throughout the year "to assist Texas pecan growers in growing pecans profitably through education, research, promotion, and advocacy." After all, it is TPGA's mission statement.

Below we will highlight some of the TPGA efforts, focusing on different segments of the mission statement. We have also included a list of some of our membership benefits in this mailing. Additionally, make sure you are getting the TPGA and *Pecan South* email newsletters and following us on social media to keep up all that is going on in the pecan world!

We want to first highlight the immense amount of projects accomplished through grant money on behalf of Texas growers. In the last two years, TPGA has handled \$706,000 in grants focused on horticulture and pest education, research, supply chain issues, marketing, and more. This is the most funds the association has obtained and managed to support Texas pecan growers. This year's awarded Specialty Crop Block grant will focus on creating an assessment of the Texas pecan industry, its producers, and their needs. TPGA and Texas A&M partnered together on this grant to conduct surveys and town halls around the state. The information collected through this grant will be incredibly important in assessing the needs of growers and creating solutions through organization and industry projects. Please plan to take part and keep an eye out for more news on this project!

TPGA's education program reaches its peak at the Annual Conference and Trade Show. This year's 102nd show will be July 30 to August 2, 2023, at a new Embassy Suites facility in Denton, Texas. The new facility, top-notch educational program, events, and more are something you don't want to miss! Of course, throughout the year TPGA is providing an abundance of educational materials through the website, e-newsletter, and *Pecan South* magazine. *Pecan South* is included in your membership and brings you cutting-edge horticulture and business articles, industry updates, and much more each month.

To provide tools and information for our members, TPGA propels pecan research forward. Whether advancing research at the state colleges and universities such as Texas A&M, contributing on the national stage through the USDA Agricultural Research Service pecan breeding program and national health studies, or sponsoring the Brison Scholarship each year, TPGA works to provide opportunities for continued pecan research.

Promotion of your Texas pecans is always at the top of our list, so you have the best chance to sell your pecan products. We continue to offer recipe and nutritional brochures, the consumer magazine *Pieces of Pecan*, the Holiday Trail Map, sponsorship of the Texas Pecan Show, and more each year to promote your pecans. The last two years we have partnered with the Texas Department of Agriculture, who received \$4 million in grant money to promote Texas products, and put pecans front and center. Projects—to name a few—included food shows for producers, consumer promotions, and inbound trade missions bringing in foreign buyers. Last but not least, our two websites have listings for members, and during the fall we see 40,000 visitors to the website with 65% of people looking at the Where to Buy section. If you aren't listed, be sure to contact our office!

Advocacy was added to our mission statement last year, but as one of the founding members of the National Pecan Federation (NPF), TPGA has been giving members a voice in Washington, D.C. for several years. The work we do with NPF has provided pecan growers trade mitigation payments, disaster relief assistance, increased focus on reducing the tariff into India, an additional \$17 million to the ARS pecan program, among many other grants and projects. TPGA has been on the front line of this work, as well as leading efforts focused on state government advocacy, partnerships with universities, and connections with pecan industry groups.

Over the last five years, the value of TPGA membership has greatly increased, with over \$300,000 in membership services, not including grants, staff costs, and less quantifiable benefits such as physical and online promotions. TPGA provides a strong value for a reasonable price, with \$200 membership fees. Each member would have to pay an estimated \$2,543 in dues annually to match just the baseline services being offered, and we are adding more membership benefits each year!

As we work each day on behalf of our members, I'm proud of the work our staff and Board of Directors have accomplished. The TPGA team looks forward to continuing to carry out the mission of TPGA and advancing the needs of its members.
